

Minutes Annual Meeting September 3, 1977

The annual meeting of the West Virginia Chess Association was held on September 3, 1977 at West Virginia University Morgantown, West Virginia.

President Joe Barker called the meeting to order and requested nominations for officers for the coming year. The following nominations were made and persons elected.

The President called for the Minutes of the last meeting and the Financial Statement to be read. It was moved and seconded that they be approved as read. Motion passed.

Charleston volunteered and was accepted as the site of the next meeting and tournament.

The 1978 edition of the Spring Open (*No Prisoners) attracted seven fewer entrants than the 1977 event but was nevertheless an exciting tournament. After the penultimate round, seven players were tied for the lead at 3-1 and there was the possibility of eight players tieing for first place with identical $3\frac{1}{2}-1\frac{1}{2}$ records! Decisive results were obtained on the top four boards in round five, however, and there was "only" a three-way for the top spot.

State Co-Champion Paul E Harless and State Junior Champion Mark S Hathaway shared top honors with 4-1 scores (+3, -0, =2). Despite having their tournament activity curtailed recently, Paul and Mark played solid, enterprising chess, were never in any danger of losing during any of their games, and rightfully deserved their accolades. David Hansen, Andrew J Glancy, Brett Thompson, and Joe Carico shared the under-1600 prize.



Here's a good position to study. It is from the 1977 West Virginia Championship, round 5 Jeff Ashley versus Paul Harless. (Jeff annotated this game in the Jan '78 WVCA Bulletin) In the position diagrammed at the left, White (Ashley) has just played 42 Kh2 (after 41...Rg8+) and proposed a draw. After more than twenty minutes thought, Harless accepted. However, Black seems to win after 42...Qe4. For example: 43 f3 Qf3 44 Rb7+ Kd6 45 Rb6+ Kc7 46 Be5+ Bd6! or 46 Rc6+ Kc6 47 Qe6+ Bd6+! If 43 f4 then 43...Rg4 and there are three main possibilities: A. 44 Bf6? Qf3 and the White Queen is blocked

from e6.

B. 44 Rb7+ Kc6 45 Rb6+ Kc7 46 Be5+ Bd6!! C. 44 h5 Rh4+ 45 Kg3 Rh1!! with the ideas of 46...Bh4 Mate or 46...Rg1 and mate follows 46 Rb7+ Kc6 47 Rb6+ Kc7 as in Variation B.

Give Joe Barker half credit for this analysis. He found the first couple of moves and ideas on White's defences. Only Variation C with the back-rank attack was missed within ten minutes after the game.
