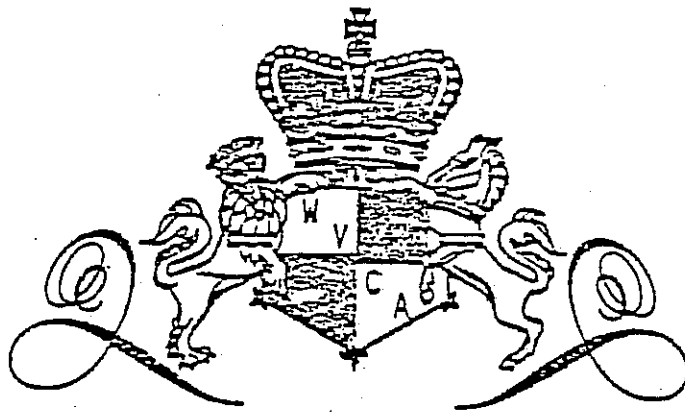

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PROPOSED REVISION: WEST VIRGINIA CHESS ASSOCIATION CONSTITUTION

Drafted by Marvin R Barker, Jr

ARTICLE I

The name of this organization shall be the West Virginia Chess Association.

ARTICLE II

Its purpose shall be to promote acquaintance, understanding and fellowship among chess players of West Virginia. It will also conduct the annual State Championship over the Labor Day weekend and be responsible for any other events the membership or Board of Directors shall select. It shall put out a Bulletin at least twice a year.

ARTICLE III

Membership shall consist of all interested in the game of Chess. There shall be business meetings held, preferably during the State Championship, for the purpose of electing officers and transacting Association business. Members are entitled to vote in person or by written or mailed proxy. There shall be the following classes of membership:

Honorary life members -- no dues, full voting privileges

Members over 18 years of age -- \$5.00 annually for dues

Members 18 years and under -- \$3.00 annually for dues

Membership dues are payable in advance, with credit given for expired quarters. Fiscal year shall begin and end with Labor Day. Residence outside the state is not a bar to membership; however, it is a bar to holding the title of State Champion. Military personnel and college students who are home on annual leave or summer vacation are eligible for the title as long as prior to their enlistment or enrollment they were residents of the state.

ARTICLE IV

Officers of this Association shall be President, Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer, and Bulletin Editor, duly elected at the annual business meeting. The president shall preside at all business meetings. He will appoint committees. He will act as Chairman

1 b3 (The Larsen-Nimzovich Attack--a move employed very successfully by Bent Larsen in the late sixties and earlier seventies until Boris Spassky won two games against him as Black while he employed this line.) 1... e5 2 Bb2 Nc6 3 e3 d5 (Spassky used Nf6 and then d6.) 4 Bb5 Bd6 5 c4 Nf6 6 cd Nd5 (The position now looks like a reverse Sicilian with White having played two ideas that have not proved very successful for Black: 1 Pinning Black's Queen Knight with Bb5; 2 Fianchettoing the White Queen Bishop by b3 instead of Sicilian-type a3 and b4) 7 Bc6?! (An interesting idea. However, it cedes Black the center by allowing him to play a later c5 with a Maroczy Bind. It would appear that White's extra tempo by employing a Black system is not much of a success. It should also be noted that White's light squares -- d3, b3, f3-- may become weak.) 7... bc 8Ne2 (Perhaps 8 Nf3 should be tried) 8... 0-0 9 a3 (To stop a possible Nb4 attacking d3 which Black might follow up with Ba6. I could have done this the previous move and this idea would have certainly been playable, but I had a much different idea in mind) 9... Be6 10 0-0 Rb8 (Now that White has played a3 weakening b3 --a light square! This will be quite important in a few moves.) 11 d3 (With the idea of Nd2-c4 attacking my e-Pawn and shielding his b-Pawn; However, it has a defect. I spent 20 minutes thinking about my next three moves and their ramifications.) 11... c5 (Grabbing control of the center) 12 Nd2 f5 (Let him attack my Pawn on e5--passive defense isn't my style!) 13 Nc4 f4 ! (Hitting his e3 which was weakened when he fianchettoed his Queen Bishop) 14 e4 Nf6! 15 f3 !? (Here is the first crucial moment in the game. With Ne5 or Be5 can White grab the e-Pawn. No, he can't! I'll let you figure out why, but here are a few hints: Black has great potential along the g8 to a2 diagonal (remember 10...Rb8) and there is a possibility of a Ne4 in some lines, as well as f3 for Black in others. Dennis Funkhouser and I spent 20 minutes analyzing this position and thought that Black would have all the chances after White captures on e5 with either piece. The move played is solid but passive and allows Black a nice attacking position.) 15... Nd7! (The e-Pawn is now protected, Black fully controls the center and has a lot more space. In short, Black has a winning advantage.) 16 Qc2 Rf6 (Here comes the attack.) 17 Rf2 Rh6 18 g3 ? (A wasted tempo) 18... Qg5 19 g4 Rh4! (To clear the way for h5.)

20 Kh1 h5 21 gh Qh5 22 Rg1 Kf7 (To allow the Queen Rook to go to g8 or h8.) 23 Qd1 Rh8 24 Rgg2 Bh3! (This wins the exchange since a Rook move back to g1 loses to Bg4!!) 25 Qg1 Bg2+ 26 Qg2 g5! (Black plans to open the g-file and triple the major pieces on it thus mating on g1.) 27 Nc3 a6?! (27... g4 is strong and will win. At this point, my opponent had 5 minutes to make his remaining 18 moves. I had 35 minutes remaining but elected to try and play on his time trouble by making my moves quickly. This was a foolish idea and costs me the game. It really is a shame as up to here I played very well.) 28 Nd5 Rg8 (To enforce g4) 29 b4 cb? (29... g4!) 30 d4! g4 31 de Bc5?? (31... gf! will still win.) 32 Nf4!! Qh7 (Now it is I who is lost!) 33 e6+ Ke7 34 Rd2 Nf6 35 Bf6 Kf6 36 Rd7 gf (Too late, but I was desperate.) 37 Qb2+ ! Kg5 38 Qe5+ Kh6 39 Rh7+ Kh7 40 Qf5 and Black shortly resigned. What is to be learned? Well, do not rely upon your opponent, jsut make the best moves and use your time properly, particularly when you already have a won position.
