After finishing reading the December issue of the West Virginia Chess Bulletin tonight, I'm truly inspired to write this small note.

I would like to take this moment to formally congratulate Dennis Funkhouser on his victory in the 1980 state championship. Every state chess player knows of Dennis's accomplishments this year. He is, in my opinion, the finest player in the state. What most chessplayers probably aren't aware of is Dennis is a champion in another endeavor. He reflects the best in sportsmanship and conduct. These traits are hard to find in a competitive ego versus ego game. My first encounter with Dennis was when I drove from Delaware to Huntington in 1975 to play in the Marshall Open. Needless to say I had the opportunity to play and lose a fine game against him. Dennis showed friendship and kindness to me and I've never forgotten him for it.

Having extensive tournament experience in Delaware, Maryland, Pennsylvania and New Jersey, it was only fate that I met Dennis in the World Open during the Bi-Centennial at the Sheraton Hotel in Philadelphia. As Dennis would admit, we both rekindled our friendship over a few skittles games during the rounds. Little did we realize that hot summer day that four years latter we would both hold West Virginia State titles. A year later I found myself as a resident and student in this beautiful state.

In 1978, Dennis and I played a marathon game in the State Championship which resulted in a draw. I never told Dennis that I stopped recording the game after move 125. Dennis found humor when I suddenly went in a deep concentration to analyze a monotonous move around move 140.

It was only through Dennis's and Carl Kiser's kind friendship that they convinced me to return to active play after two years of dissatisfaction and inactivity to enter the 1980 State Championship.

Dennis has and will always give me the one element left for me to ever play chess again, the enjoyment of playing a good, competitive friendly game of chess. Congratulations and thank you, Dennis.

TOURNAMENT NEWS

It certainly appears that West Virginia Chess is alive and well. There is enough activity for two bulletins! Anyway, there are four old news events from last year that I want to tell you about. The first three were Carl Kiser's productions: Die Young-Stay Pretty Match, Mixed-up at Ted's Quad and the Kiser-Cummings Match. All of these produced some good games, although I never understand how Carl comes up with his names. One old tournament, the C.T.II, was played in Morgantown last November, but arrived too late for publication in the December bulletin. Congratulations to Andy Katz and Ack Morgan for winning that twenty one player event.

Things really got rolling in February when the annual Charleston Club Championship started. Eighteen players participated in three preliminary sections to determine the six finalists. The winners of the sections were Don Griffith, Charlie Szasz and Dennis Funkhouser with Dave Marples, Andy Glancy and this editor rounding out the final six. What a club final. Four of the six were former state champions and the fifth the current state champ. The winner is: Dennis.....? Marvin Barker! Sorry about that folks, Dennis won so many last year his name is almost automatic

In late February, the Huntington Open was held, a twenty seven player event. Annew Face joined the crowd in the form of Manual Armada, who is a candidate master player from Puerto Rico(?). We are glad to have him and hope he stays. Now for the winner: Den.....? David Hansen! A real shocker as he bested this editor, Dennis, Don Griffith and drew with Mr. Armada. Congratulations on winning and earning that new, high Category I rating.

In late March a tournament was held in Athens with Rusty B. Potter, Master from Virginia, being the winner. This editor tied for second along with Dr. Bernard Kiernan of Bluefield. The winner was 5-0 with Dr. Kiernan and I at 4-1.

Finally the most unusual tournament I have seen in West Virginia in a long time; the Charleston Open. It was small, only eighteen players, but extremely strong: average rating over 1860! For an eighteen player event in this state that's somekind of average. It also had some unusual results. Paul Homer, rated 1523, pulled two major upsets. He bested Carl Kiser (1940) and Mark Smith (1967) and gave Don Griffith and Steve Canterbury all they could handle. Additionally, there were six candidate masters in the event: Dennis Funkhouser, Don Griffith, John (red) Roush, Paul Harless, Manual Armada and this editor whose rating has not caught up with him as of yet. This is the only event in this state that I can remember having that many players in that rating class. The first indication of just how unusual a tournament it was going to be occurred in the first round when Steve Canterbury pound Dennis Funkhouser into a rook-down position and with plenty of time on the clock went into deep thought, thus losing on time in a dead-won position. And now the envelope, please: the winner: D.....? Marvin Barker. Hey, that's me again. Oh well, it just goes to show that nice guys don't always finish first. See you next issue.
