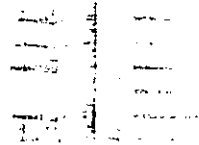

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

Minutes Annual Meeting September 3, 1988

The annual meeting of the West Virginia Chess Association was held on September 3, 1988 at Tygart Lake State Park Lodge, Grafton, West Virginia.

President Terry Riley called the meeting to order and welcomed all to the annual tournament and meeting.

The minutes of the 1987 meeting were read. David Bruner moved that they be approved as read. After second the motion passed.

The financial statement for the fiscal year September 4, 1987 to September 2, 1988 was read. John Roush moved that they be approved as read. After second the motion passed.

OLD BUSINESS:

The following items were discussed;

1. To receive USCF Funds, WVCA must have an approved plan to expend the money.
2. John Roush is to write Charles Szasz to require that High School Teams in the State join WVCA as affiliate members.
3. That with the relatively few number of Bulletins being mailed, that it is cheaper to mail at the regular rate instead of the bulk mail rate.
4. Pre-printed generic Certificates of Achievement are available from trophy stores. Our own Certificates could be privately printed for us, but at a higher cost. John Roush moved that Randy Bierce find a printer and the cost for doing this and to report to Tom Bergquist who in turn would notify the Board of Directors for approval and let Randy know the decision. After second the motion passed.
5. Terry Auvil is to receive a free membership under the ongoing free membership program.
6. Terry Riley awarded the Postal Trophy to David Bruner.
7. David Bruner reported on new USCF changes adopted at the USCF Annual Meeting.

NEW BUSINESS:

John Roush moved that a new 10th Article to the Constitution be adopted, that; sudden death playoffs be

eliminated for the State Championship Tournaments and that they be conducted 40 moves for the first 2 hours and 20 moves per hour thereafter. After second the motion passed by over the 2/3 required vote, 14 for to 3 against.

Marvin Barker, Constitutional Committee Chairman is instructed to make the above changes.

Randy Bierce moved that a Constitutional Amendment be adopted that would require starting for the 1990 site that the state tournament sites alternate between northern and southern geographical locations in the state and that if the area whose turn it is fails to bid, then the bid is deferred to the other area. After discussion and second, the motion failed to pass by the required 2/3 majority, 10 for to 7 against.

Lawrence Iorio announced an October Tournament in Fairmont to which all are invited.

Terry Riley appointed John Roush President pro tem to preside over the meeting while he (Terry Riley) made two motions.

First Motion; To install a West Virginia Grand Prix Circuit Prize System. (The complete details are on a separate page and attached as Appendix A at the end of the minutes as an integral part of these minutes.) After discussion and second the motion passed.

Second Motion; To eliminate free memberships awarded to WVCA State Championship Tournament winners. After second the motion passed.

President Riley reassumed the chair.

1989 Tournament Site Selection

John Roush proposed two Charleston area sites;

1. West Virginia Rehabilitation Center at Institute which would be free.
2. H & R Block site in South Charleston which would cost \$10.00.

Lawrence Iorio proposed a free site at Fairmont State College sponsored by the Marion County Chess Club.

Jeff Crook moved that the bids be closed and after second passed.

The vote on the site selected the Charleston area location for the 1989 tournament and meeting.

Motion by Terry Riley for a West Virginia Grand Prix Circuit

The following is a proposal which will hopefully increase the interest, participation, and number of Chess activities in the State. It will also have the potential to increase the WVCA membership rolls.

The proposal is to offer prizes for the best year long chess performances in an open section as well as in individual Classes. Players will accumulate points by playing in qualifying events.

Three factors must be present for an event to count:

1. The event must be open to all West Virginia Residents.
2. The event must be advertised in Chess Life.
3. The event must either give a discount to WVCA members or require WVCA membership.

Points will be allotted as follows:

	1st	2nd	each class winner(ABCD/E)
West Virginia Championship	5	2 1/2	2 1/2
Two-Day Event (Minimum 4 rounds and no faster than 40/90)	3	1 1/2	1 1/2
One-Day Events (Including Action Events)	2	1	1

The event will begin immediately following the Labor Day Weekend, and will conclude with the close of the Annual State Championship.

Players who change classes during the year will be considered as to belong to the Class in which he/she spent most of the Grand Prix Year.

Prizes are open to be awarded as follows: First Place Open 1 year free membership and free entry into the following State Championship. Second Place and First per Class- 1 year free membership:

These points are all open for revision and will be considered at the Annual Business Meeting in Grafton WV.

The below proposal is the brainchild of Terry Riley and will be presented for consideration at the annual business meeting.

West Virginia Absolute Championship.

Be a part of the ultimate West Virginia Championship. The absolute will be a round robin of the 10 highest rated players in the state based on the annual list for 1989 (or at least the 10 strongest who wish to play). For once there will not be any "out of state" masters to complicate the results.

This event will be held in March through April, 1990. This will not conflict with national events nor major tournaments. The site will be in the Fairmont-Morgantown area or the Charleston area, as dictated by the entrants. Players who are from the same area will be allowed to play their games at other times and locations, during the two month period. This will cut down on traveling time and expenses. Players would receive a copy of the complete schedule including assignments for each weekend and color allocations. A perfect chance to prepare your best game.

The games will be rated by the USCF. Players must be members of the USCF. WVCA membership is mandatory. Membership for both organizations are available.

Entry fee for this event will be \$37.50 for each player. The prize fund will be first place \$300.00 and second place \$50.00. If two or more tie for first they would split the \$350 evenly.

Time controls for the event will be 50/2, secondary 20/1, and tertiary GAME/60. Three games will be played on each day. Colors will be decided by overall pairings not by weekly pairings. Thus a player may have white or black for the two/three games for one day. This will be avoided if feasible.

Players who are interested should send a card to that effect to the address below by December 31, 1989. DO NOT SEND ANY MONEY! The top 10 applicants will be sent an entry form by February 1, 1990. The 1989 Annual List will be used for pairings. Should this event not draw at least 10 players, it will be canceled. If you do not receive an assignment sheet by February 1, 1990 you may assume that you either did not make the field or the event has been canceled.

The tournament will be sponsored by the West Virginia Chess Association, and will be directed by XX. Applications should be sent to the director at XXX.

When this writer started playing chess in high school (1973-1975), one player had established an almost complete dominance. Wilson Gibbins of Huntington, West Virginia won the 1973, 1974, and 1975 State High School tournaments with a 6-0 score in each! An amazing achievement when you think about it.

After high school Wilson headed to Ohio State and never quite found his way back to West Virginia on a permanent basis. Recently, Dr. Neil Gibbins, his father, delighted us with some news about Wilson.

Not in any of my books. It avoids 5...Nc6 6.Bb5

6. d4 cd
7. ed Nxc3

During the game, I was worried about 7...Bg4, putting pressure on my isolated queen pawn. In the comfort of my home, I discovered 8. Bc4 Nxc3 9. Ne5! Bxd1? 10. Bxf7 mate. Black can do better with 8. Bc4 e6! In later analysis, Rob showed that my attempt to win a pawn with 9. Bxd5 ed 10. Qb3 leads to a messy game after 10...Bxf3.

8. bc e6
9. Bd3 Bd6
10. 0-0 Qa5
11. Ne5!?

Probably a silly move, but I didn't like the idea of Rob getting his queen over to the kingside. Both 11.c4 and 11.Bd2 look OK.

11. Bxe5
12. de Nc6

After 12...Qxe5, 13.Ba3 traps the black king in the center for a while, compensating for the missing pawn.

13. f4 Qxc3
14. Rb1

Not 14. Be3? Nb4.

14. b5
15. Rf3 Qa5
16. Be4 Bb7
17. Bd2 Qd8

Perhaps black can take a second pawn with 17...Qxa2. Then 18.Rc1 Nd8 19.Bxb7 Nxb7 20.Bb4 gives white some pressure with the black king once again caught in the center.

18. Rd3 Qb6†
19. Be3 Qa5
20. Qf3 Rc8

Black cannot play 20...Qxa2 because 21.Rbd1 Rc8 22.Bxc6 Bxc6 23.Qxc6+ Rxc6 24.Rd8+ Kd7 25.R1d7 mate.

21. Bc5?!

I can win a piece for two pawns with 21.Rd6. With time running short, I decided to go for a knockout that wasn't there. Not 21.Rc1? 0-0! and if white captures three times on c6, black finishes with 24...Qe1 mate.

21. Qa4!
22. Re1?

I had to defend against 22...Nxe5, attacking my queen and bishop. The correct move was 22.Kh1!, as 22...Nxe5 23.Bxb7 Nxf3 (without check due to 22.Kh1) 24.Bxc8 threatens 25.gf and 25.Bd7+ Kd8 26.Bxb5+.

22. Ne7?

As Rob pointed out after the game, 22...Na5! is much better.

23. Bxe7 Bxe4
24. Rxe4 Rc1+
25. Kf2 Rc2+
26. Kg3 Qxa2
27. Red4 f5

27...Kxe7 allows mate in 3.

28. ef Qa1
29. Qh5+ Resigns

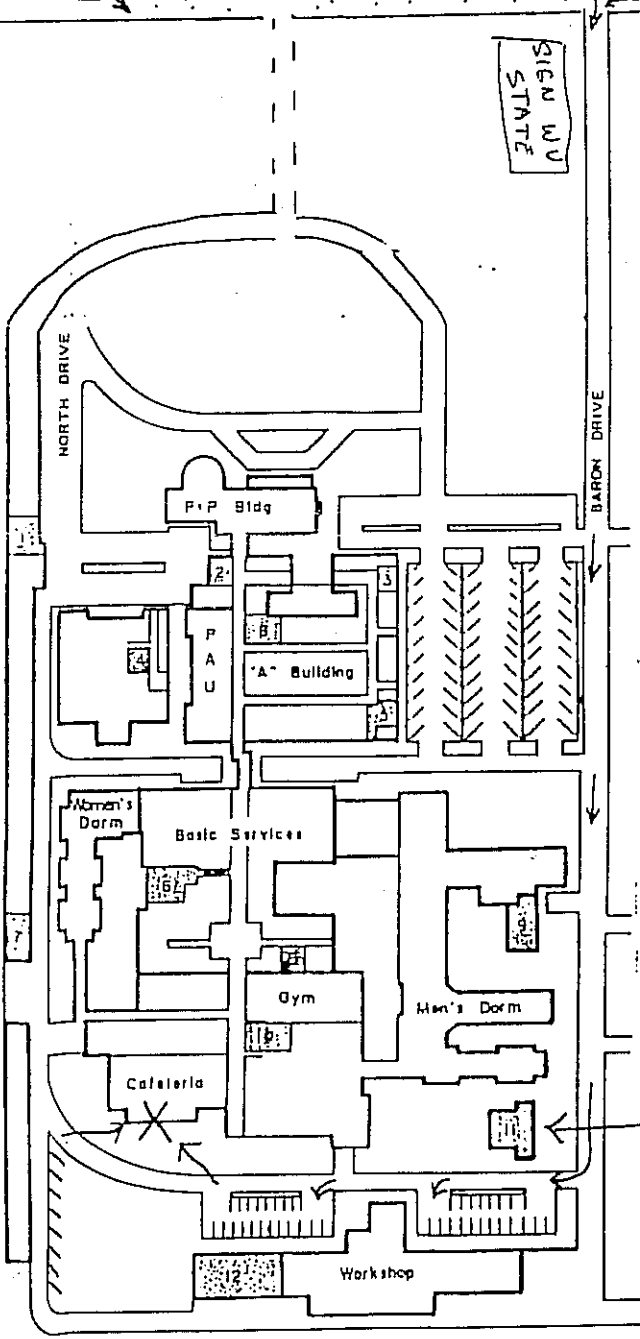
