Apologies are in order for this issue being tardy. Materials and time were a rare commodity this year.

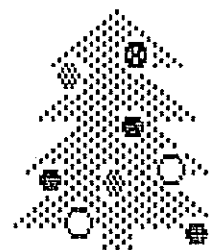
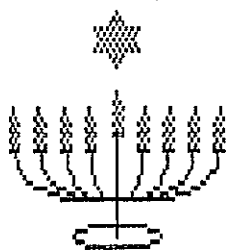

Minutes Annual Meeting September 1, 1990

The annual meeting of the West Virginia Chess Association was held on September 1, 1990 at Triadelphia, West Virginia.

President John Roush called the meeting to order and welcomed everybody to the meeting and tournament.

In the absence of Tom Bergquist, the president appointed Terry Riley as acting Secretary.

The minutes of the 1989 meeting were read. One correction was made; that the words "verbal resignation" be changed to "oral resignation, read by John Roush." Konstantin Dolgovskij moved that the minutes be approved as corrected. After second, motion passed.

A temporary financial statement called in by the Treasurer was read. This was not approved at the present time.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Randy Bierce informed the members that the free certificates are printed and available for this year's tournament winners.
2. The Absolute Championship was cancelled with no plans to hold it in the future.
3. The Postal Champions are;
 - A. John Roush
 - B. David Bruner
4. John Roush announced that Charlie Waugh had resigned as USCF Delegate and that Samuel Conner had been appointed in his place.
5. John Roush read Delegate Conner's report on the USCF Business Meeting. This report is part of these minutes as Appendix A.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Discussion was held on purchasing printing equipment for the Bulletin. Various methods were discussed including personal copiers and Ditto machines. Randy Bierce offered to donate a used Ditto machine in need of repair. No motions were entertained though.
2. Mike Taylor initiated a discussion of reducing the number of Bulletins or eliminating them entirely. The general consensus of the membership was against this. No motion was made.
3. Since there weren't any projects proposed for the USCF monies, the Secretary-Treasurer or Presi-

dent is ordered to inform USCF to hold over our funds for one more year.

- 4. Terry Riley moved that the Constitution be amended to change the Junior membership "with" Bulletin to \$7.00 annually. After second, motion passed 19-0.

President Roush ordered the Constitutional Secretary to make the appropriate change.

The chair entertained bids for the 1991 Meeting and State Tournament.

Mike Baker moved that a site offered in Lewis County, tentatively set for Lewis County High School in West-on be accepted. This site will be free with prizes based on entry fees.

Charlie Waugh moved that the site selection bids be closed. After second, both motions passed 18-1.

Motion to close by Butcher. After second, Bierce was elected 19-0.

USCF Voting Member (1) - D. Funkhouser by Dolgovskij

Motion to close by Waugh. After second, Funkhouser was elected 19-0.

Postal Director - M. Baker who declined

- T. Riley by K. Dolgovskij

Motion to close by Maier. After second, Riley was elected 18-0.

Bulletin Editor-Constitutional Secretary

- T. Riley and John Roush serve as Co-Editors by Dolgovskij

Motion to close by Waugh. After second, both were elected 17-0.

Secretary-Treasurer - T. Bergquist by Behr

Motion to close by Butcher. After second, Bergquist was elected 19-0.

Vice President - J. Hohn by K. Dolgovskij

Motion to close by Dolgovskij. After second, Hohn was elected 18-1.

President - John Roush by K. Dolgovskij

Motion to close by M. Taylor. After second, Roush was elected 13-5.

President Roush reassumed the chair.

Meeting adjourned.

APPENDIX A

Thank you for the opportunity to attend the Annual USCF Business Meeting as the West Virginia representative. The meeting convened at 9AM on August 12, 1990, and recessed at 5:30 PM that same day. The meeting reconvened at 9AM on August 13, 1990, and adjourned *sine die* at 5:30 PM on the thirteenth. The meeting covered over seventy principal motions proposed by the delegates and the Policy Board (PB), plus considered approximately the same number of "friendly" resolutions and amendments that came from the floor.

General Impressions

The initial motions put forth by the delegates covered a wide variety of topics, many of which ended up being referred to the Policy Board or to appropriate committee. This development occurred in part because (1) the PB did not accurately gauge the measure of opposition some of their proposals would incur, (2) a strict time limit on speakers was not imposed and adhered to, (3) Everybody had to get their say in on some matter, and (4) President Winston lost control of the meeting by Sunday afternoon, only worsening a situation already afflicted with the above conditions. By the time discussion came around to the Lakdawala/FIDE resolution, debate was dominated by arguments over people and personalities rather than issues.

A great deal was accomplished at the meeting. However, a little presience and pre-meeting politicking by the PB would have saved a a great deal of time.

Specific Issues and Decisions

Policy Board Elections: With the exception of the Treasurers race (Gary Sperling over Dam Burg by 45 votes), all the other races were blowouts. President-Max Dlugy over Harry Sabine. V.P.-Frank Camaratta over Ed Butler. Secretary-Randy Hough over Robert Tanner. Member-At-Large-John Donaldson over Mike Nolan. Opening salvos for the 1991 At-large seat were fired, with trial balloons being sent up by Jerry Hanken of California,

David Mehler of Maryland, Pete Nixon of Michigan, and William Orgain of Tennessee.

Membership Categories: Tournament Memberships, Participating youth memberships and Computer memberships were eliminated. In all categories, the player/unit will simply receive a Regular membership of some type. Computers will still have to go through special procedures to get memberships and to be rated.

A resolution proposing the elimination of Junior Tournament Memberships (JTP) was referred to the Scholastic Committee for consideration as to whether to eliminate or modify the category. A resolution forbidding the use of JTP's at national scholastic events was defeated.

Budget/Rating Fees: The amended budget proposed by the PB and passed by the Delegates (although opposed by this delegate) carried a \$29,000 deficit. The deficit came in part to putting \$11,000 dollars into Tournament Incentives (previously funded at \$0--listed under Other services & Program Exp. on p. 16 of the Annual Report) and in part to the large loss the USCF would take from the US Open 1990. This year's Open had 318 players (counting Busymen and crossovers from the US Championship), and estimates of the USCF loss ranged from 15,000 to 20,000 dollars.

Many resolutions were proposed to reduce the rating fee to thirty of forty cents (from the current fifty cents). Eventually, all the resolutions were referred to the newly-elected Policy Board. In open session, the new PB decided to keep the rating fee at the current level for 1990-91 due to the unforeseen budget deficit.

By-Laws Amendments: Several cosmetic changes were made in the By-Laws to bring them into line with recent changes in Illinois corporate law. The USCF is a corporation chartered in Illinois.

"Open-Air" Resolutions: Various resolutions were proposed to insure open-air dealing with USCF business. ADM-38 was passed, resolving all PB meetings would be open to the public except when discussing matters pertaining to personnel evaluations or pending litigation. Other resolutions proposed were defeated as being too intrusive at

a time when the PB is attempting to take a non-micromanagement position with the main Office in new Windsor. Also, there resolutions came up for discussion in the portion of the meeting where the chair was losing control and the delegates were starting to feel their oats.

Delegate Apportionment: I was informed that West Virginia would lose a voting member in the 1990-91 apportionment. I was also given to understand that W.VA. only missed getting the voting member by three members. I can only go by what I was told, I am not the WVGA president and was not given a copy of the apportionment list for 1990-91.

Conclusion

The 1990 Annual meeting and the surrounding workshops indicated that the USCF is in fundamentally good shape, and a sense of optimism about the future prevailed. All were excited about the Kasparov-Karpov match coming to New York City, although no one was happy about the high prices that are being bandied about for the tickets.

In sum, the meeting was one where several small but important details were dealt with. However, the failure to sound out the Delegates before hand and the insistence to draw out every debate led to the meeting running much longer than was needed for the material that had been submitted for discussion.

Finally, thank you for the opportunity to attend the Delegate Meeting as the West Virginia representative. It was my pleasure to do so, and it was an educational experience not soon to be forgotten.



There is a rather familiar face once again in the winner's circle this year. John Roush has completed the trifecta, or hat trick if you will. This makes the fifth time he has won or shared the title, including the last three straight. He has also regained a master rating. Congrats!

Sharing the title this year is Andy Katz, a member of our state legislature. This is his second title, both having come in his backyard (the Northern Panhandle).

An out-of-state player Paul Zelinski also tied for the win, but of course is not eligible for the title. Finishing a half-point off of the lead was Dennis Funkhouser.

The tournament was held near Tridelfhia, which is near Wheeling. The chosen hotel could not honor the room contract, as the rooms were taken by the Red Cross. Fortunately space was made available in hotel rooms. Although bathrooms were a luxury, proper lighting was not.

The tourney went for the most part without major problems. One small error was allowing a player to forfeit 3 games, and actually be given a bye after two consecutive forfeits! Others included players not receiving their membership cards, and/or prizes.

Randy Bierce was very kind in giving out FREE scoresheet booklets. These were used to such an extent that there were not any scoresheets turned in for publication. Promises to zerox copies and/or "round up" some games of course were fleeting at best. To date these still have not materialized.

I must once again apologize for not being able to share with you many quality games from states. What follows is the unabridged compilation of games that have darken my mailbox.
