Unless otherwise indicated, the notes to games and various scurrilous comments are by me, John Roush. As a result of his recent injury, I am helping David Hines with the Bulletin.

The notes are my honest opinion, but usually the result of my impressions or instincts about the position rather than in-depth analysis. While in-depth analysis, especially if performed by a stronger player than me, would be nice, we don't have the space and I don't have the time. You should take my comments for what they are worth and don't rely upon them too heavily.

Mr. O.T. is the data base from Chess Assistant 6.0. It has not been updated since it was created about 2000. Consequently, it is a little dated. Tiger 13.0 and Crafty (not to be confused with Lewis "Crafty" Sanders!) are chess analysis engines from Chess Assistant 6.0.

I don't give the chess analysis engines very much time to analyze the positions and the engines are a decade (or more) old. Hence, while their "opinions" have some value, it is not comparable to the conclusions of Shredder or some more powerful, newer program.

I "gave" positions to Tiger 13.0 or Crafty for a 30 second glance when I wanted a second opinion or was generally puzzled/unclear about the evaluation of the position. For the most part I didn't disagree with the conclusions of Tiger & Crafty, but remember that they didn't get a position if I had a strong opinion on it already!



In November 2009, the WVU Chess Club was reactivated, thanks largely to the efforts of Phil DiSalvo, who served as club president during the 2009-2010 academic year. The club meets on Monday evenings, when classes are in session, from 6:00-9:00 in the Mountainlair food court. Most meetings are informal, and afford students the opportunity to take a break from studying to play some chess for fun. Interest in the club has been strong; typical attendance at a meeting is between 12-15 students. More than 50 students have stopped by at least once for a game, and are on the club's e-mail list. The playing strength of members ranges from novice players to several members with USCF ratings above 1500, and beginners are welcome. Non-students are welcome to attend; however, as a recognized WVU student organization, voting and holding office are limited to WVU students.

In April, the club held a non-rated club championship. It was run as a four-round Swiss, and the winner and club champion is Simba Nkomo, a post-doctoral student in Chemistry, with a perfect 4-0 score, edging out Jacob Nixon who had a strong result of 3-1. Simba was very active in chess in his home country of Zimbabwe, and tutored several chessplayers there who have since achieved Master strength.

At the end of the spring semester, new officers were elected for the 2010-2011 academic year. They are:

As the 2010-2011 academic year begins, the club plans to increase its efforts to attract new members and promote awareness of the club on campus. Ideas that have been discussed include getting shirts with a club logo, and organizing a match with other college/university chess clubs.
