MILTON ELLENBY WINS TRI-STATE MEET WITH SCORE OF $4\frac{1}{2}$; WERTHAMMER SECOND

MILTON Q. ELLENBY OF DAYTON, OHIO, WON THE FIRST ANNUAL TRI-STATE CHESS CHAMPIONSHIP, PLAYED NOV. 10 AND 11 IN THE DOWNTOWN YMCA AT PITTSBURGH, BY A SCORE OF $4\frac{1}{2}$ - $\frac{1}{2}$.

HE YIELDED ONLY ONE DRAW AND THAT TO THIRD-PLACE WINNER WILLIAM BYLAND OF PITTSBURGH IN THE FIFTH AND FINAL ROUND OF THE EVENT.

DR. SIEGFRIED WERTHAMMER OF HUNTINGTON, W. VA., 1943 AND 1944 CHAMPION OF WEST VIRGINIA, FINISHED IN SECOND PLACE WITH A SCORE OF 4-1 HE LOST ONLY TO ELLENBY.

BYLAND IN THIRD PLACE WITH $2\frac{1}{2}$ WAS TIED WITH M. W. PATRICK OF CLEVELAND. LEONARD COHEN OF PHILADELPHIA WAS FIFTH WITH $1\frac{1}{2}$.

HARD LUCK MAN OF THE TOURNAMENT WAS HAL LIGGETT OF SOUTH CHARLESTON, 1945 WEST VIRGINIA CHAMPION, WHO SIMPLY COULDN'T GET GOING AND FINISHED UP WITH A ZERO SCORE. HE PLAYED SOME BEAUTIFUL GAMES BUT WOUND UP EACH TIME WITH A LOSING END POSITION. AND THEN, TO TOP IT ALL OFF, HE HAD TO LEAVE ON AN EARLY BUS SUNDAY NIGHT IN ORDER TO GET BACK FOR WORK NEXT DAY AND HAD TO FORFEIT HIS FINAL GAME.

HAL'S SUNDAY EVENING ABSENCE, HOWEVER, DID GIVE A CHANCE FOR SOME OF THE OTHER PLAYERS TO EXPRESS THEIR OPINIONS ABOUT HIM AND SUCH COMMENTS AS "LIGGETT'S A PRINCE OF FELLOW," "HE PLAYS A SWELL GAME," AND "HE CERTAINLY GOT SOME TOUGH BREAKS," WERE HEARD ON ALL SIDES. AND EVERYBODY SAID, "HE'S A GOOD SPORT!"

ELLENBY, WHO NOW IS THE FIRST CHESS CHAMPION OF WEST VIRGINIA, OHIO AND PENNSYLVANIA, IS A SPLENDID CHAP. THE TRI-STATE TITLE WAS THE THIRD FOR THIS 22-YEAR-OLD MASTER IN LITTLE MORE THAN A YEAR. HE WON THE ILLINOIS JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIP SHORTLY BEFORE HIS 21ST BIRTHDAY AND LAST LABOR DAY ANNEXED THE OHIO STATE.

SETUP FOR THE TRI-STATE WAS TO HAVE THE CHAMPION AND THE RUNNER-UP FROM EACH STATE PARTICIPATING. WEST VIRGINIA AND OHIO WERE ABLE TO DO THIS BUT PENNSYLVANIA CHAMPION IRVING HEITNER WAS UNABLE TO MAKE THE TRIP FROM PHILADELPHIA AND RUNNERUP ATTILIO DICAMILLO OF THE SAME CITY BECAME ILL LAST WEEK AND COULD NOT MAKE IT. PARTICIPANT COHEN WAS 5TH IN THE PENNSYLVANIA TOURNEY AND BYLAND 11TH.

AS TO STATE STRENGTH SHOWN IN THE MEET, OHIO ANNEXED A TOTAL OF 7 POINTS, WHILE WEST VIRGINIA AND PENNSYLVANIA GOT 4 EACH.

THE SCORES OF THE 14 GAMES PLAYED WILL BE FOUND ON PAGES 6, 7 AND 8 OF THIS BULLETIN. THE SCORES LIKELY WILL NOT BE FOUND PERFECT BUT THEY ALL "PLAYED" BEFORE YOUR EDITOR BEGAN TYPING THEM OFF. MAY YOU HAVE FUN GOING OVER THEM!

THE PLAY BY ROUNDS WAS AS FOLLOWS:

ROUND 1--ELLENBY (W) WON FROM PATRICK, WERTHAMMER (W) WON FROM LIGGETT, AND BYLAND (B) WON FROM COHEN.

ROUND 2--ELLENBY (B) WON FROM COHEN, WERTHAMMER (B) WON FROM BYLAND, PATRICK (W) WON FROM LIGGETT.

ROUND 3--ELLENBY (W) WON FROM WERTHAMMER, BYLAND (B) WON FROM LIGGETT, PATRICK (W) DREW WITH COHEN.

ROUND 4--ELLENBY (B) WON FROM LIGGETT, WERTHAMMER (W) WON FROM COHEN, PATRICK (B) WON FROM BYLAND.

ROUND 5--ELLENBY (W) DREW WITH BYLAND, WERTHAMMER (W) WON FROM PATRICK, AND COHEN WON FROM LIGGETT ON A FORFEIT.

ROUNDS 1 AND 2 WERE PLAYED SATURDAY AND THE OTHER THREE SUNDAY.

WINNERS WERE AWARDED PRIZES AS FOLLOWS: FIRST PLACE, ELLENBY, \$15; SECOND, WERTHAMMER, \$10; THIRD PLACE TIE, BYLAND AND PATRICK \$2.50 EACH.

IN TEAM PLAY, A WEST VIRGINIA TEAM COMPOSED OF MILFORD MOTT, ROBERT CREAN AND GENE COLLETT, OCCUPYING BOARDS IN THE ORDER GIVEN, LOST TO A PENNSYLVANIA TEAM COMPOSED OF THE REV. MR. PAAL, R. N. RAMME AND WM. MALLORY, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ - $\frac{1}{2}$. CREAN GOT A DRAW. THE PENNSYLVANIA TEAM MEMBERS WERE ALL FROM PITTSBURGH.

LATER, THE WEST VIRGINIA TEAM, AUGMENTED BY WILLIAM GEORGE AT FOURTH BOARD, LOST EVEN MORE DECISIVELY IN A DOUBLE-ROUND MATCH WITH OHIO, 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ - $\frac{1}{2}$. THE OHIO PLAYERS, IN ORDER OF BOARDS, WERE: E. J. KRISCH, CLEVELAND; CARL DRISCOLL, DAYTON; JOSEPH CHAVAYDA, CLEVELAND, AND CHARLES BIELECKI, CLEVELAND. MOTT GOT WEST VIRGINIA'S LONE DRAW.

THESE GAMES WERE PLAYED SATURDAY. ON SUNDAY OHIO AND PENNSYLVANIA CLASHED IN A DOUBLE-ROUND 10-BOARD MATCH WHICH PENNSYLVANIA WON BY THE OVERWHELMING SCORE OF 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ -6 $\frac{1}{2}$. (ONE BOARD ON THE FINAL ROUND UNPLAYED.) FEATURES OF THE PLAY INCLUDED THE 1-1 SCORE OF 15-YEAR-OLD LARRY FRIEDMAN OF CLEVELAND AGAINST ROBERT REEL, PITTSBURGH, FORMER CHAMPION OF WISCONSIN; AND THE 2-0 VICTORY OF R.W. WILSON, PITTSBURGH DOWNTOWN Y CHAMPION, OVER JOSEPH CHAVAYDA, NO. 1 MAN ON THE CHAMPIONSHIP INDUSTRIAL TEAM OF CLEVELAND.

GOOD SPORTSMANSHIP WAS MARKED THROUGHOUT THE MEET, BOTH IN THE CHAMPIONSHIP TOURNAMENT AND IN THE TEAM PLAY. NOT A SINGLE POINT AROSE THAT REQUIRED SETTLEMENT BY A TOURNAMENT COMMITTEE--AND EVERYBODY HAD A SWELL TIME, EVEN THE BOYS WHO LOST!

A TRIPLE FLASH!

I. Eric M. Hassberg, eminent composer and problem editor of the Chess Correspondent, has founded the American Problem Pool; to which all composers may send their creations for distribution to publications and tourneys, throughout the world. He will act as the sole trustee of the "Foundation" and judge of the distribution of problems therein. Nos. 55, 56 and 57 are from that "pool".

II. Thus far, this department is for beginners--and it is primarily here, alone, that the new composer has a chance for publication of his problems! Therefore, we extend a special invitation to all novitiate composers to send us their creations; however poor they may think them to be. Do not be afraid or ashamed--if we find them worthy we will publish them--even if we have to polish them a bit! Nos. 58 and 59 are from two aspirant composers in our little family of problemists.

III. Nos. 60, 61, 62 and 63 are published on a dare. We invite comments on these problems--constructive criticisms will be published with solutions (more will be said on them at that time). We welcome more of these dares--their discussions should arouse great interest in our circle!

SOLUTIONS TO SEPT. PROBLEMS

Note: solvers need not give complete main variations to 3-movers--all they have to do, to receive full credit, is to give them as shown above (see No. 45)!

A and B are cooked (see below). C: 1. Rf3.

A proved to be a comedy of cooks--we have eliminated all of them (we hope) by changing its setting from 2R3B1-7Q-8-8-4q3-3k1S2-8-b2S1K2 to 1sR3B1-7Q-8-8-4q3-3k1S2-3B4-b4K2. B (2r1R3-3pB3-b2pp3-5p2-5Q1S-2P5-2B1k2s-1S2bK1) is made sound by shifting its WS from h4 to g5. The keys and cooks (for which full credit will be given) of these two problems will be accepted for the next two months!

THEME

If we set up (on the chessboard) a number of men merely to produce mate in a stipulated number of moves we will not have a chess problem (at best, we may have an end game but not a problem)--this is not the idea of the problem. The scope of the chess problem is to express a chess concept or strategy in a pure, simple or poetic form! This chessic idea is called the theme of the problem. The theme is the "soul" of the problem--the manner of the mate and the stipulated number of moves (of the problem) are secondary and, at times, dependent upon it! Some themes are most simple incorporated in one or more moves of the problem, while some are most complex, permeating the whole problem--between these two extremes there is a very long gradient of themes. Henceforth, our lessons will be mostly on themes and their definitions and explanations.
